Auto Body Repair is a 2000 hour course designed to give the graduate a basic understanding of the trade, through observation, demonstration, and practical experience.

Much of the practical experience is given on cars belonging to the public. The student starts making minor repairs on older cars or pickups and then progresses through all the steps of repairing and refinishing until he finally repairs wrecks.







The course covers the knowledges and skills necessary in the performance of all services offered in today's modern beauty shops. Other required subjects are hygiene, sanitation, sterilization, business management and laws pertaining to the craft.





PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT!

The Practical Nursing course is approved by the Minnesota Board of Nursing and it is a course planned to give theory and practical training in the fundamentals of patient care in the home or hospital. The theoretical training is given in the nursing classrooms of the Area-Vocational School and the practical experience is received in Northwestern Hospital, Thief River Falls, Minnesota. Students also receive six weeks of psychiatric training at the Fergus Falls State hospital. The Student Practical Nurse (LPN) upon satisfactorily completing 50 weeks of training and passing the state board examination. Licensed Practical Nurses assist physicians and professional nurses, serve in the home, hospitals, institutions, doctors' office, health agencies, and where nursing services are needed.

The student gradually begins practice in the hospital. She learns to apply the class-room experiences to the actual patient. This helps to prepare the nurse for the future when she will be more independent.
