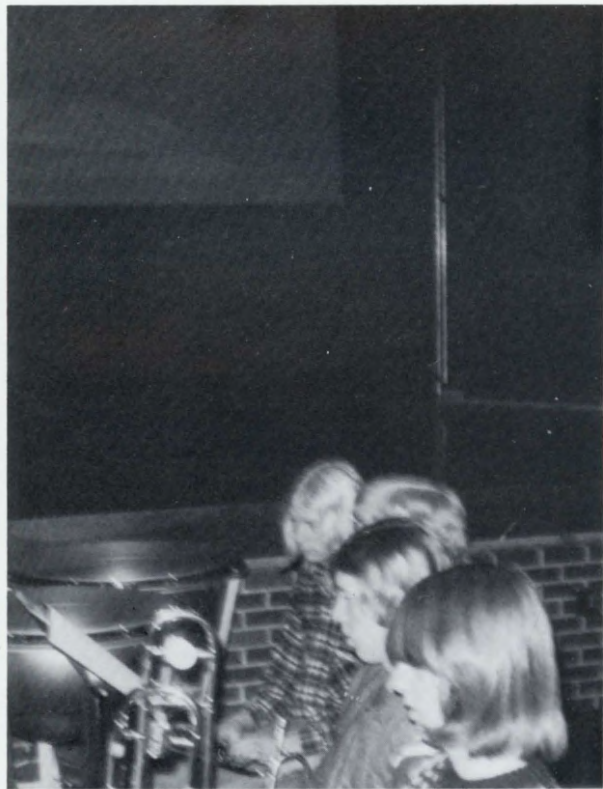
# "CARNIVAL"

The Minnesota State Community College Board held its December meeting at Northland. Besides holding its regular meeting, board members met with Northland's administrators, faculty and students.

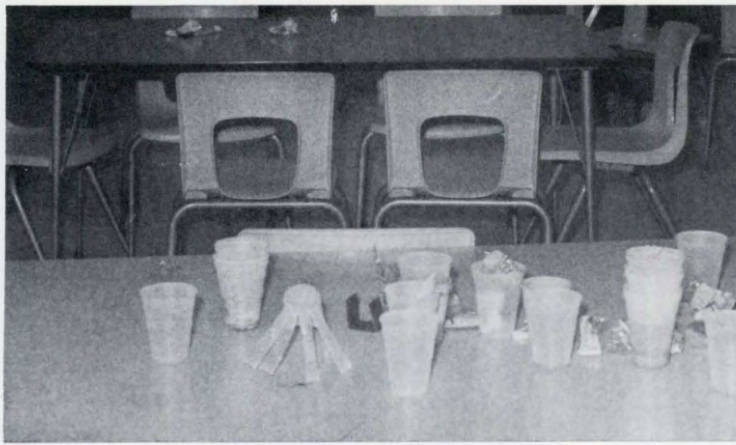
