


"ARNT AUNE, DIRECTOR"

Arnt Aune first joined the AVTI staff as an instructor in 1957; he has served as Director of the school since 1960. In his 19 years as Director, Arnt has done much to promote Vocational Education in Northwestern Minnesota.

As Director, Arnt is in charge of some 50 full time employees. He cooperates with all instructors in assisting in the placement of the AVTI graduates. Assisted by the program advisory committee members he strives to improve existing programs and to develop new programs to serve the needs of the community. He has direct responsibility over the financial operations of the Institute. This includes the development and implementation of the school budget as approved by the State Department of Education. Arnt represents the Institute at all district Board of Education meetings, at the general advisory committee meetings, and at state director and budget meetings. In addition, he works continously with the staff to improve programs and curriculum throughout the school year.

"FRED BALLOU, ASS'T DIRECTOR"

Fred Ballou joined the AVTI staff in 1960 as an auto body instructor; he became Assistant Director in 1976. As Assistant Director Fred is actively involved with the students, the faculty, and the community. This includes many hours of recruiting at statewide career days sponsored by the various high schools. e also serves as faculty supervisor and evaluator in cooperation with the Director. He works with the instructors to arrange informative workshop sessions for in-service days. As Assistant Director one of his primary duties is assisting in the structuring of each program to the individual's need, interests, and abilities. It is his hope that each student at the AVTI will develop the attitude and skills to fulfill their career objectives.

"ROBERT REEVE, STUDENT PERSONNEL"

Bob Reeve is Director of Student Personnel Services. Student Personnel Services is located in the main office area, and is designed to assist all vocational students with items of concern to them. Among the many things you might wish to discuss are: vocational objectives, progress in class, outside social or emotional problems, and financial aids (work study, student loans, scholarships.)

Students should feel free to consult with these offices during any free time or by making an appointment with the main office.

The counseling office and entire staff of the AVTI is interested in the program and success of each student's growth and and independence through an increasing knowledge of personal development and opportunities available to students in educational and vocational training.





The Support Serice Department is available to all students. The purpose of this department is to give special assistance to any student experiencing difficulty in a regular vocational-technical program, whether it may be in an area of basic skills or his chosen field of vocational education.

Assistance is tailored to the individual student and may include: program modification, individual tutoring, agency referral, facility modification, counseling, and other forms of supplemental service.

The main purpose of the Small Business Management Program is to assist business operators in achieving their business and family goals through the improved management, organization, and operation of their business.

Up-to-date records are kept of all business transactions and important family expenditures. At the close of each business year the records are analyzed to determine the strengths and weaknesses of the business.

Instruction includes monthly class sessions held at the AVTI and individual instructions by the instructor at each business. During these visits the business family and instructor can study specific questions and problems pertaining to the individual business.

Using applied business management principles, instructors discover with the enrollees the strengths and weaknesses of their businesses. Through skills gained in this program, the weak points can then be minimized, allowing the business operator to make progress toward his/her established goal.

ADULT VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

The Thief River Falls AVTI offers additional educational opportunites to northwest Minnesota residents through its adult vocational program. These courses, workshops, and seminars are offered to meet the following objectives: to allow residents to upgrade themselves in their present job or career; to allow residents to retrain themselves to enter a different occupational field; to allow the unemployed person training opportunities for employment; to extend the AVTI learning opportunities to all communities in northwest Minnesota; to provide specialized and customized 'in-house' employee training for industry; and to provide 'pre-employment' training for local industry.

Instructors for all adult vocational education courses are professionals and representaties of business and industry who have many years of experience in their fields.

The Minnesota Vocational Agriculture Farm Management Program is available to all Minnesota farmers through a local Vocational Agricultural Instructor. The program is based upon the principles of management, education, and the development and achievement of goals. It is oriented toward the farm family, and its primary responsibility is to assist the family to reach its goals. The annual analysis program supplies the farmer with a computerized depreciation schedule and a very complete analysis of his/her farming operation. In addition, the farmer works with a farm management instructor who teaches basic accounting procedures and helps individuals to budget, interpret his/her analysis, plan operations, and plan credit needs. The ag man also helps the farmer to keep up with the latest agricultural developments.

The program has grown rapidly. Farmers' credit sources and agribusinessmen enthusiastically endorse it. This year, there are 1,000 farmers in Northwestern Minnesota participating in the program and 5,000 enrolled in the whole state of Minnesota. The program now extends into North Dakota, Alaska, Oregon, Connecticut, Nebraska, Washington, Wisconsin, South Dakota, Iowa, and Idaho.

To enroll, contact your local vocational agriculture instructor. If your school does not have a vo-ag department, contact the vo-ag coordinator at the Area Vocational Technical Institute. Any farmer in Minnesota may enroll. A fee is charged to cover the cost of preparing the analysis report. The present analysis fee is \$55 per record.




From the original three programs, the school has grown to a total of 20 programs with a full time enrollment of over 450 students. In addition to the full time students, the institute serves about 3,000 others annually through afternoon and evening adult education programs offered throughout Northwestern Minnesota.

Because of the uniqueness, quality, and experience of the AVTI and its programs, students are attracted from throughout the State of Minnesota and several neighboring states.

The Area Vocational Technical Institute is approved by the State Department of Education. It is approved for trianing under the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, Veterans Public Law No. 94-502, and the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Thief River Falls is located in Northwestern Minnesota, 300 miles north of Minneapolis-St. Paul, and 45 miles northeast of Grand Forks, North Dakota.


